**Purpose:** The purpose of the Charter Schools Program – Planning/Implementation grant program is to support new charter schools with the resources they need to start at full capacity, leading to a strong first year of operation, and success beyond. This grant program supports initiatives related to the planning, program design, and initial implementation of charter schools by providing funds for the refinement of the educational program; professional development for staff; community engagement; and operational costs related to educational materials and supplies.

**Basis of Allocation:** The Louisiana Department of Education (LDE) submitted a competitive application in 2015 to the U.S. Department of Education to support Louisiana's charter schools. LDE was awarded funding to support charter schools in spring 2016. Allocations will be provided to charter schools through the federal CSP grant program. Recipients of funds submitted competitive grant proposals to the department and were evaluated using a rubric by a review committee. Funding determinations were based on each applicant's score and quality of the proposed plan. These allocations include planning (\$165,000) for year 1 (\$75,000) and year 2 (\$75,000) of implementation funding.

**Purpose:** The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) requires school systems to build plans to improve struggling schools. The state must use 7 percent of the state's Title I funds to support high quality improvement plans. In Louisiana, these funds will be competitively awarded to school systems that build the strongest plans for improvement. Recipients of school improvement funding must comply with all terms of the grant, including:

- purchasing Tier I curriculum for implementation in classrooms at the start of the fall 2020 school year; and
- providing training to teachers on the implementation of Tier 1 curriculum.

**Basis of Allocation:** ESSA provides school improvement funding to implement state-approved plans for schools identified for school improvement. The LDE reviewed applications from eligible schools and determined allocations based on whether the plan met requirements. Plans that met requirements received funding. LEAs that do not meet the requirements of the grant within the specified timeline will forfeit these school improvement allocations.

**Purpose:** The Louisiana State Personnel Development Grant (LaSPDG), a five-year federal grant, intends to improve literacy outcomes for students with disabilities (SWD) through the development of a systematic professional development (PD) framework using evidence-based practices: data-driven decision making (DDDM), evidence-based literacy practices, and coaching.

**Basis of Allocation:** LEA's receiving allocations were required to meet the following criteria:

- 1. be identified as UIR for students with disabilities;
- 2. be in the initial stages of implementing Tier-1 ELA; and
- 3. need additional funding for professional development in grades 3-5.

These allocations must be spent on professional development for ELA and special education teachers in grades 3-5 within UIR schools. Funds are intended to support vendor partnerships, attendance at the Teacher Leader Summit, participation in Intervention Content Leader, and/or the redelivery of content leader modules.

**Basis of Allocation:** This pilot program will provide funding for a school system launching a two-way immersion classroom. Recipients receive \$10,000 for each qualifying two-way immersion classroom for up to six classrooms.

**Purpose:** The purpose of the Preschool Development Grant B-5 Seats is to strengthen states' early childhood systems, including providing subgrant funding to offer fully-funded birth through three-year-old seats for economically disadvantaged children. In the 2020-2021 fiscal year, this program will serve approximately 625 children in Louisiana. Sites enrolling seats funded through PDG B-5 will adhere to state-approved guidelines and regulations.

**Basis of Allocation:** All early childhood community networks are eligible to apply for funding of seats through the Super App. Due to funding limitations, Ready Start Networks are prioritized for seat funding. Actual reimbursement is based on recipients filling all allocated seats and students meeting attendance thresholds. Awards for this program are contingent upon approval of funding.

**Purpose:** The purpose of the Nonpublic School Early Childhood Development (NSECD) Program is to collaborate with nonpublic schools and Type III child care centers in providing high-quality, developmentally-appropriate preschool instruction and services to preschool-aged children who are considered to be at risk of achieving later academic success. The NSECD Program provides six hours per day of prekindergarten instruction. The program is offered at no cost to those children whose families fall below 200 percent of the federal poverty level.

**Basis of Allocation:** All BESE/Brumfield-Dodd-approved nonpublic schools and licensed accredited Type III child care centers are eligible to submit an application for funding. Money is awarded on a per pupil basis at \$4,580 per child, per year. Actual reimbursement is based on students maintaining 74 percent monthly attendance. Award amounts are based on reported enrollment, performance profile ratings, Early Childhood Community Network participation, and parish need. Awards for this program are contingent upon approval of funding.

**Purpose:** The purpose of the Cecil J. Picard LA 4 Early Childhood Program is to provide high-quality early childhood educational experiences to four-year-old children who are considered to be at risk of achieving later academic success. The LA 4 program provides six hours per day of educational experiences. The program will be offered at no cost to those children whose families at or below 200 percent of the federal poverty level. In 2020-2021, LA 4 will serve 17,094 children. Programs will adhere to state-approved guidelines and regulations.

**Basis of Allocation:** All school systems and charter schools are eligible to submit an application for funding. Allocations are based on prior participation, participation in an Early Childhood Community Network, and community need. Monies are allocated on a per pupil basis at \$4,580. Actual reimbursement is based on recipients filling all allocated seats and students meeting attendance thresholds. Award amounts are based on the 2019-2020 final allocations for student participation for each of the participating school systems. Awards for this program are contingent upon approval of funding.

- 7.1.2 On motion of Mr. Roque, seconded by Ms. Voitier, the Board directed that a letter be transmitted to the Governor and to the Legislature, requesting senate confirmation of Dr. Cade Brumley as State Superintendent of Education, and Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget (JLCB) approval.

With no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned at 11:12 a.m.
