The Louisiana State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education met in regular session on March 10, 2021, in the Louisiana Purchase Room, located in the Claiborne Building in Baton Rouge, Louisiana. The meeting was called to order at 9:23 a.m. by Board President Sandy Holloway and opened with a prayer by Representative Raymond E. Garofalo, Chair, House Committee on Education.

Board members present were Dr. Holly Boffy, Mr. Preston Castille, Dr. Belinda Davis, Ms. Ashley Ellis, Ms. Kira Orange Jones, Mr. Tommy Roque, Ms. Doris Voitier, and Dr. Sue Weaver.

Board members Jim Garvey and Ronnie Morris were not in attendance.

Assistant Attorney General Amanda Lagroue, Louisiana Department of Justice, led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Public comments were received from Dr. Tia T. Mills, Louisiana Association of Educators.

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BESE Executive Director Shan Davis informed members of a request to amend the agenda to include discussion concerning revisions to bulletins regarding LEAP 2025 high school assessment substitutions for the class of 2021 due to COVID-19.

Ms. Davis stated that, per R.S. 42:19, unanimous approval of the members present is required to amend the agenda. Ms. Davis indicated that there would be an opportunity for public comment on any such motion in accordance with R.S. 42:14.

Ms. Davis asked for a motion to amend the agenda.

State Superintendent of Education Brumley highlighted the following in his report to the Board:

• It was one year ago that buildings were closed by the Governor in light of the global health crisis. This time was unprecedented and produced many questions regarding education and services for children. System leaders across the state made the best possible decisions given the information available. Everyone in the education field is still doing what is best for children. Louisiana's plan for education during the health crisis has kept children safe and learning. Even though it has not been perfect 100 percent of the time, the lessons learned continue to move education forward.

- Mr. Castille informed members of his participation on a task force organized by Chief Justice John Weimer and Justice Scott Crichton for the Judges in the Classroom program. This program allows judges across the state to share knowledge of the judicial system with students in K-12 education.
- Dr. Davis, serving as BESE representative for the Louisiana Educational Television Authority (LETA), informed members of the phenomenal partnership with the LDE concerning educational programming and the hopes of expanding resources going into the summer months especially for early childhood.

Purpose: The purpose of this program is to support educator development through the use of mentoring. The program provides funds to LEAs and educator preparation providers to pay stipends to the mentors of undergraduate year-long residents.

Basis of Allocation: Allocations to LEAs and BESE approved preparation providers are to provide funding for undergraduate mentor stipends.

Through a data collection process, educator preparation providers and local school systems identified undergraduate residents and assigned them mentors. Mentors supported residents completing a residency from both January 2020 through December 2020, and August 2020 through May 2021.

IDEA funds were allocated at a 100 percent rate if the resident being supported by the mentor is pursuing special education certification. TIF funds were allocated if the residency occurred in a TIF district.

This allocation is an update to the allocation which was brought in January 2021 based on data confirmed by school systems.

Student Centered Goals - Competitive

On motion of Ms. Voitier, seconded by Ms. Orange Jones, the Board approved the following allocation:

Allocation: Pre-Educator Pathway (Grow Your Own)

Amount: \$100,000.00

Period: 07/01/2020 – 06/15/2021

Source of Funds: 8(g) - State

Purpose: In order to ensure a robust, diverse pipeline of educators in the profession, the LDE is supporting the development and implementation of Grow Your Own programs in several pilot school systems. These pilots will support school systems in creating and implementing courses for high school students who are interested in the teaching profession.

Basis of Allocation: School systems interested in implementing a Grow Your Own program applied for competitive funding. Twenty-five schools and/or school systems submitted applications. Funding is intended to support curriculum adoption, professional development, initial training, and student organization or credentialing costs. Nineteen schools and/or school systems were selected for funding.

Funding recipients agree to:

- offer a pre-educator pathway course in the 2021-2022 school year;
- select a qualified instructor for the course by 03/01/2021;
- ensure that a diverse population of students enroll in the course;
- strategically recruit students who belong to underrepresented identities in the system's workforce to the course;
- attend monthly LDE facilitated support check-ins from March 2021 – May 2022;

- participate in LDE guided reflections aimed to identify pathway opportunities and challenges; and
- provide information related to curriculum, finance, operations, and personnel aimed to isolate best practices.

Source of Funds: State, Federal

Purpose: Eight regional planning grants of \$50,000 each will be allocated for the Fast Forward program. These funds will be utilized by lead school systems in each region to create pathways which allow students to earn a Jump Start TOPS Tech Career Diploma or a TOPS University Diploma while simultaneously earning an Associate Degree or participating in a state-recognized pre-apprenticeship/apprenticeship opportunity.

Basis of Allocation: A collaboration between the LDE and the Board of Regents to collectively provide \$400,000 (\$200,000 Perkins - \$200,000 Board of Regents). Fast Forward is designed to increase the number of students earning Associate Degrees or participating in state-recognized pre-apprenticeships/apprenticeships in high school.
