BOARD OF ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY EDUCATION

Student Enrollment (LAC 28:CXXXIX.2713)

In accordance with the provisions of R.S. 17:6(A)(10) and the Administrative Procedure Act (APA), R.S. 49:953(B)(1) et seq., the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE) proposes to amend LAC 28:CXXXIX in *Bulletin 126 – Charter Schools*. Act 659 of the 2024 Regular Legislative Session revised requirements that charter schools meet a certain threshold with respect to the number of students with exceptionalities and economically disadvantaged students compared with total student enrollment. At the August 2024 Board of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE) meeting, the board approved revisions to policy contained in *Bulletin 126 - Charter Schools*, in response to Act 659. These revisions further clarify that policy.
